### Start Date:

- **Saturday August 21, 2010**

### Address:

- 300 S. Cottonbelt Dr., Wylie, TX
  - o Just west of downtown Wylie off Cottonbelt and Fleming.
- From St. Anthony go South on Ballard to either W. Marble St. or W. Oak St. and turn right. Go to Cottonbelt and turn left. Follow Cottonbelt until you dead end at the railroad tracks.

### Time:

- 7:00-7:30 AM arrival

### Duration:

- Summer schedule. Due to the anticipated heat, building will conclude between 1:00 - 2:00 PM on each Saturday.
- Construction to take place each Saturday (rain or shine) from August 21<sup>st</sup> – approx November 20<sup>th</sup>.
  - o Excluding Labor Day Weekend – September 4<sup>th</sup>, October 16<sup>th</sup>, and November 13<sup>th</sup>.

### Needs:

- **Volunteers (15-20 per build date for the first 4-6 weeks).**
  - o **Attendance each week is requested but not required.**

### Experience:

- None needed. If you can hold a hammer you are qualified.
- Must be at least 18 years of age (male or female)

WHO WE ARE: An organization of area churches from all denominations with a desire to reach out into our community through the local Habitat for Humanity organization. It allows all religious affiliations to work side by side to improve our community and give a family a jumpstart in life.

A quick note on Habitat for Humanity families: The family has to put in 400 hours of sweat Equity on their home working side by side with the construction crews. They pay for the home (interest free loan) over a 15 to 20 year period, pay taxes on the home, and keep the home and yard maintained. They are responsible homeowners and begin contributing to society at a higher level.

How does our church get to work on the home?

Kyle Thornton, director of Saint Anthony Habitat for Humanity organizes workers from our parish for any given workday. Usually homes are built on 10-12 consecutive Saturdays. Please contact Kyle if you are interested.
